The Board of Management of Bracken ETNS recognises that child protection and welfare considerations permeate all spects of school life and must be reflected in all of the school's policies, practices and activities. Accordingly, in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Education and Skills' Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post Primary Schools, the Board of Management of Bracken ETNS has agreed the following child protection policy:

HSE (Health Service Executive).

- 1. In its policies, practices and activities, Bracken ETNS will adhere to the following principles of best practice in child protection and welfare. The school will:
  - recognise that the protection and welfare of children is of paramount importance, regardless of all other considerations;
  - · fully co-operate with the relevant statutory authorities in relation to child protection and welfare matters
  - adopt safe practices to minimise the possibility of harm or accidents happening to children and protect workers
    from the necessity to take unnecessary risks that may leave themselves open to accusations of abuse or neglect;
  - · develop a practice of openness with parents and encourage parental involvement in the education of their children
  - fully respect confidentiality requirements in dealing with child protection matters.

The school will also adhere to the above principles in relation to any adult pupil with a special vulnerability.

5. The following school policies, practices and activities are particularly relevant to child protection: Positive Behaviour and Anti-Bullying Policy, Pupil Attendance Strategy, Supervision of Pupils, Sporting Activities and School Outings, Gard Vetting, Working Alone with a Child, Transport of Children, Traffic Management, Fire Drill Procedures, SPHE, Stay Safe.

The Board has ensured that the necessary policies, protocols or practices as appropriate are in place in respect of each of the above listed items.

- 5. This policy has been made available to school personnel and the Parents' Association (if any) and is readily accessible to parents on request. A copy of this policy will be made available to the Department and the patron if requested.
